This year's Conference focuses on supporting children's agency in a diverse and multilingual world. In today's interconnected world, empowering children to become confident, capable learners requires recognizing and celebrating the rich linguistic and cultural assets they bring to our classrooms. Child agency represents a student's capacity to make meaningful choices about their learning, express their ideas authentically, and take ownership of their educational journey. For multilingual learners, agency becomes particularly powerful when we honor their complete linguistic repertoire as a strength rather than a deficit. When children feel safe to use their home languages, share cultural perspectives, and navigate between different linguistic worlds, they develop stronger metacognitive skills and deeper engagement with learning. This authentic agency transforms classrooms into vibrant communities where every voice matters. Creating inclusive, agency-centered learning environments for multilingual students is an ongoing journey that requires commitment, reflection, and continuous growth. Educators benefit from understanding both the research behind multilingual education and practical strategies for implementation. Against this backdrop, we will discuss experiences and approaches from different contexts trying to develop the necessary skills to support multilingual and diverse learners' agency.

This event is open to all who are interested in early childhood education and care. Together with guests from different countries, we want to share experiences and concepts regarding diverse and multilingual children's agency from an international perspective. The aim is to get into conversation with each other and to think outside the box.
